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LOOKING BACK : DECEMBER 2025



December is a time for reflection and sharing. In the warm atmosphere at the end of the year, the school and its students created many memorable moments through meaningful learning and experiential activities.

Understanding Emotions in the Teenage Years – Teenagers' Love Workshop

Students from Years 8 to 12 at the Central Saigon campus recently took part in a series of well-being activities organised by the School Counselling team,

aimed at supporting real-life, everyday emotional aspects commonly experienced during adolescence.

Through interactive discussions and hands-on activities, students explored how to recognize, understand, and express emotions in a healthy and respectful way within the school environment. The workshop encouraged self-awareness, empathy, and positive connections with peers.

Key objectives and content:

- Understanding emotions: Normalizing teenage emotions and helping students develop a healthy perspective on their first romantic feelings.
- Setting standard boundaries: Distinguishing between appropriate and inappropriate displays of affection within the school context.
- Enhancing social skills: Suggesting ways to express affection and care subtly, respecting oneself, others, and the social environment.

Demo Class with the University of Adelaide

At the West Saigon campus, students take part in an inspiring demo class with the University of Adelaide, where they explore economics topics which are relevant to everyday life under the guidance of university lecturers.

Professor Tony Cavoli led the "From Pho to Finance: The Economics of Everyday Life" seminar, which covered essential ideas in public finance,



economic policy, and the digital economy. Using real-life examples from Vietnam and the ASEAN area, the seminar helped students comprehend how economic decisions affect both society and individuals.

- Reflecting on and assessing personal discipline in daily learning and routines
- Being recognised for demonstrating positive discipline in class & school activities
- Receiving encouragement and support from family while building disciplined habits
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5 Practical Ways for Students to Build Discipline:

- Plan each week ahead and prioritise important tasks before less urgent ones.
- Take a moment at the end of each day to reflect: Did I follow my plan today?
- Follow classroom and school rules consistently to develop positive routines.
- Acknowledge personal progress, even small improvements, along the way.
- Speak up and seek support when facing challenges in staying disciplined.
